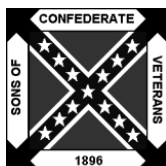

CHARLES HEMMING

Charles Cornelius Hemming was born in Jacksonville on 16 September 1844 to John Charles Hemming and Maria Olivia DuPont. His father, John had migrated from England, worked as a bookkeeper and was a veteran of the Third Seminole War. John was also a member of the 16th Florida Regular Militia. When the hostilities with the North started, John was deemed too old for service but Charles enlisted as a Private in July 1861 at Fort Steele in the Jacksonville Light Infantry also known as Company A of the Third Florida Infantry.

The Confederacy purchased the schooner, *America* in 1860, a British built vessel that was used as a blockade runner. It is the namesake of today's America's Cup yacht races. In the Spring of 1862 as Union troops were approaching Jacksonville in order to occupy it, John Hemming and son, Charles boarded the *America* which was docked at the Jacksonville wharf, sailed her to a creek on the west side of the St. Johns River and scuttled the vessel to keep it out of Union hands.

With the Third Florida Infantry Charles Hemming fought in most of the battles of the Western theater with the Army of Tennessee. He was

wounded at the battle of Perryville, Kentucky. In April 1863 he was promoted to First Sergeant. He was captured at Missionary Ridge and sent to prison at Rock Island, Illinois. The winter of 1863 was one of the coldest in years. The Union officer who presided over the prison camp tried to get Hemming to spill the beans and give up secrets of the Confederacy. Hemming refused and was chained in irons outside in the brutal cold weather for three days. In September 1864 he escaped from prison dressed in a made up Union uniform. He travelled to Canada where he joined a group of raiders whose goal was to free Confederates from prison in Canada. He escaped capture a few more times in Canada before being sent on a mission in January 1865 to deliver dispatches to the Confederate War Department in Richmond. He made his way to Richmond by catching a boat to Havana, Cuba, then travelling to Florida by boat, and then continuing to Virginia mostly by foot. After delivering the dispatches, Hemming rejoined the Third Florida Infantry in Greensboro, North Carolina. In February 1865 he was promoted to a Sergeant Major for meritorious conduct. He stayed with his unit until its surrender.

In 1866 after the war Hemming followed his boyhood dream of moving out west. He moved to Galveston, Texas where he worked as a laborer on the docks and in the mercantile business in Brenham, Texas. It was here that Charles met and married Lucy Keys and they had nine children. In 1870 he got a job as a cashier at the Giddings and Giddings Bank in Brenham where he remained until 1881. At that time he moved to Gainesville, Texas where he worked as a cashier and later president of the Gainesville National Bank. He was the President of the Texas State Bankers' Association and a member of the Presbyterian Church. Eventually he moved his family to Colorado Springs where he amassed quite a fortune.

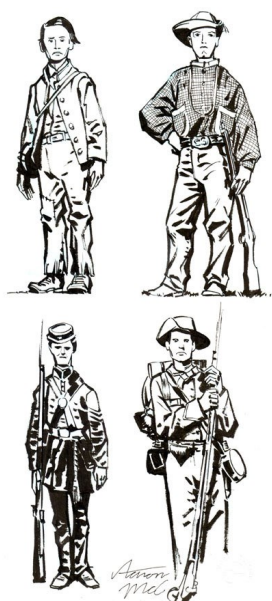
On February 22nd 1896 the United Confederate Veterans held their Florida state reunion in Ocala. It was here the Charles Hemming announced to the reunion of a plan to erect a Confederate monument in Jacksonville. After visiting a few sites he decided on St. James Park because of its fine fountain, Hemmings contracted with George Mitchell to make the 62 foot high monument topped with a bronze figure of a Confederate soldier. Hemming wanted only the most durable materials to be used for the monument as he wanted it to last for a thousand years. The figure's kepi has a hat badge on it with the letter J L I which stands for the Jacksonville Light Infantry. The base of the monument is inscribed: To the Soldiers of Florida. This shaft is by a comrade raised in testimony of his love, recalling deeds immortal, heroism unsurpassed. With ranks unbroken, ragged, starved and decimated, the Southern soldier for duty's sake, undaunted, stood to the front of the battle until no light remained to illumine the field of carnage, save the luster of his chivalry and courage. Nor shall your glory be forgot, While fame her record keeps. Or honor points the hallowed spot where valor proudly sleeps. The monument was a gift of Charles Hemming to the City of Jacksonville and was installed in the park in 1898 to a great fanfare with many dignitaries attending. In 1899, Jacksonville renamed it Hemming Park to honor him. The Sons of Confederate Veterans, Florida Division was established in 1898 and the first camp was the Charles C. Hemming Camp #80 in Ocala.

Charles Hemming died in Colorado Springs on 27 May 1916 and is buried beside his wife in Evergreen Cemetery there. His obituary appeared in the Jacksonville newspaper and the Confederate Veteran magazine among other publications.



Dance & Brothers

The J.H. Dance & Brothers revolver was the idea of a group of patriotic Texas brothers and cousins who operated a machine shop in Columbia, Texas. They had no experience in making firearms but produced a well made but simplified copy of the Colt Dragoon pistol in .44 and .36 calibers. Overall production of the pistols never topped 500 units, most of which went to Texas cavalry units. The Dance brothers themselves enlisted and served in Texas cavalry units but eventually most were detailed to the factory along with about 24 of their fellow cavalymen to serve as workers. The Confederacy needed arms-makers more than it needed cavalymen. Like the Spiller & Burr company, the Dance Brothers had to move their factory for fear of Union attack and the Confederate government eventually bought them out. I examined revolver serial number 216, which is one of the finest examples extant. It showed very good workmanship, and matching numbers were in evidence on major parts. The slab-sided iron frame characteristic of the Dance pistol would have greatly simplified manufacturing since the frame could be simply cut from a solid bar versus forging or casting the frame with the recoil shields in place. The downside of this design is the lack of protection for the percussion caps on the nipples.

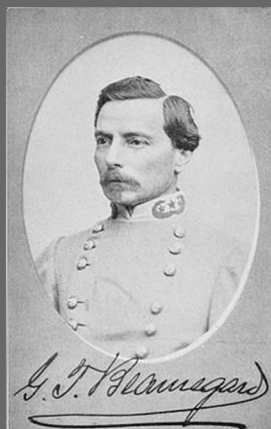
